Over 20 years ago my family and I moved from California to The Bitterroot and found the community of Spirit of Christ where we were impressed by the vibrant and welcoming faith we found there and with that of Holy Family during our joint celebrations. As time passed and we settled in Missoula and were seeking a new church, we were invited to come to John the XXIII. Here we found that same vitality and felt welcomed to stay.

As I was reflecting about beginning this Capital Campaign, I was struck by all the different emotions that have surrounded all the work we have done over the last few years to get here.

An opportunity to renew not just a building but ourselves and our relationships as well, and with luck create some new ones in the process.

The committees will help advise the Strategic Planning Committee and are an integral part in learning about the significance and importance of each topic.
