


2022 + A GUIDE for SUNDAY LENTEN SUPPER at Blessed Trinity + Spirit of Christ Building Households of FAITH

The Christian Greeting that matters most:
“**Won’t you stay for supper!**”

WELL BEFORE LENT BEGINS, determine as a household that you will gather each Sunday evening for this special dinner.

Make this a family or household Lenten resolution.

- ◆ The dinner needs to be special. Good food (which all can help prepare); a TABLE set with the best dinnerware; candlelight; real napkins; a beautiful loaf of bread, a bottle of choice wine.
- ◆ If you live alone or are a small family, invite someone to Sunday dinner every Sunday of Lent or accept an invitation to dinner at another’s home. Plan with neighbors or friends to have dinner at various homes on the Sundays of Lent.
- ◆ THE DINNER BEGINS with all seated at the table.
- ◆ Someone begins (a different person each week) with the Sign of the Cross and the PRAYER OF THE WEEK.
- ◆ Someone then reads a portion of the GOSPEL from Sunday’s Mass, as provided in this booklet. (You might choose to read the entire Gospel of the Sunday). **NOTE, this year, 2022, the Church is in Lectionary Cycle C, but since we have a person chosen for Baptism at the Easter Vigil, we will proclaim the Scripture from Cycle “A” on the third, fourth and fifth Sundays.**
- ◆ Then spend some time sharing what touched each person as the Gospel was proclaimed; **Discuss what each person remembers from Sunday’s Mass.** Use the reflection questions provided for each Sunday.
- ◆ As the conversation continues, **wine or another drink is poured.** Then all raise the glass and toast all the good that has happened the past week—especially all the good that others around the table have done for the family or friends gathered there. OR a simple statement of what each person is THANKFUL for. Then say, as the toast, **May the Lenten Spring renew the life within us, as we HONOR THE PAST, SERVE THE PRESENT AND PROVIDE FOR THE FUTURE.**
- ◆ Following the toast someone **breaks the loaf of bread** (break it, don’t cut it—remember Jesus TOOK the bread, BLEST it, BROKE it and GAVE it!).
- ◆ Dinner is served and conversation continues.
- ◆ **AT THE END OF THE MEAL, all may pray the BLESSING FOR THE JOURNEY, which will be prayed at the end of Mass each Sunday of Lent . And then...EVERYONE HELPS CLEAN UP!**



3. THE GOSPEL OF THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT, Year C:

Luke 4:1-3

*(At Home with the Word, available at the main church entrance,
has all the scripture readings for each Sunday of the year. Scripture is also available on the parish website)*

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days to be tempted by the devil...who said to him, ‘If you are the Son of God, command this stone become bread.’ Jesus answered... ‘one does not live on bread alone.’ Next the devil showed him all the kingdoms of the world... and said to him, ‘I will give you all this power and glory..., if you worship me.’ Jesus said, ...‘you shall worship the Lord your God, and him alone shall you serve.’ Then he made him stand on the parapet of the Temple and said, ‘Throw yourself down, for it is written ‘He will command his angels to guard you...lest you dash your foot against a stone.’ Jesus said, ... ‘You shall not put the Lord your God to the test... “ **THE GOSPEL OF THE LORD.**



3. THE GOSPEL OF THE SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT, Year C:

Luke 9:28b-36

(At Home with the Word, available at the main church entrance has all the scripture readings for each Sunday of the year. Scripture is also available on the parish website.)

Jesus took Peter, John and James and went up the mountain to pray... His face changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white. ... Moses and Elijah appeared in glory and spoke of his exodus that he was going to accomplish. Peter and his companions had been overcome by sleep, but awoke when they saw his glory and the two men standing with him. Peter said, ‘Master it is good that we are here. Let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah...’ While they were still speaking, a cloud came and cast a shadow...and they became frightened. From the cloud came a voice, “This is my chosen Son, listen to him.” Then they fell silent and did not at that time tell anyone what they had seen.

Jesus came to a town of Samaria.... Jacob’s well was there. Tired from his journey he sat down there, at the well. A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, “Give me a drink.” Later, Jesus said to her, “Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst. The water I shall give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life.” ...and the people said to the woman, “we no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the Savior of the world.” **THE GOSPEL OF THE LORD**

3. THE GOSPEL OF THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT: John 9:1-41, Year A

(At Home with the Word, available at the main church entrance, has all the scripture readings for each Sunday of the year. Scripture is also available on the parish website)

Jesus spat on the ground and made clay with his saliva and smeared the clay on the eyes of the man born blind and said to him, “Go and wash in the pool of Siloam.” The name “Siloam” means “to be sent.” So the man born blind went and washed and came back able to see.....And the leaders of the Jewish people threw the man born blind, who had regained his sight, out of the temple. When Jesus heard that they had thrown him out he found him and said, “Do you believe in the Son of Man?” The man answered and said, “Who is he sir, that I may believe? Jesus said, “You have seen him, the One speaking with you is he!” The man then said, “I do believe Lord!” Then Jesus said, “I came into this world for judgment, so that those who do not see might see and that those who do see might become blind.” Some of the leaders said, “Surely we are not also blind, are we?” Jesus said, “If you were blind, you would have no sin, but since you say, “We see,” your sin remains.” **THE GOSPEL OF THE LORD**

What did you notice most at Mass this Sunday? In the long Gospel Story of the “Man born blind”, what image or scene did you see in your mind’s eye? What phrase or word caught your ear? What things would you identify as darkness and light in your life right now? In the life of our world, country and church?

For Children: How can you let the light of your faith in Jesus shine for others to see?



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

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3. THE GOSPEL OF THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT, Year A John 11:1-45

(At Home with the Word, available at the main church entrance has all the scripture readings for each Sunday of the year.)

Jesus said, “Martha, I am the resurrection and the life; those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. DO YOU BELIEVE THIS?”
So they took away the stone and Jesus looked upward and said, “Father, I thank you for you have heard me. I know that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me.” When Jesus had said this, he cried out with a loud voice, “LAZARUS, COME OUT!” and the dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth. Jesus said to them, “UNBIND HIM, AND LET HIM GO FREE.” **THE GOSPEL OF THE LORD**

4. REFLECTION FOR ALL TO SHARE:

Jesus said, “Everyone who lives and believes in me will never die.” DO YOU BELIEVE THIS?

What does it mean for you and for our parish to “unbind” others and set them free?

What does that have to do with your answer to the first question, “Do you believe this?”

For Children: How can you help your friends feel more alive?



3. THE SECOND READING OF PALM SUNDAY OF THE LORD’S PASSION: Philippians 2: 6-11

(At Home with the Word, available at the main church entrance has all the scripture readings for each Sunday of the year.)

Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Because of this God highly exalted him.... **THE WORD OF THE LORD.**

As you hear Paul’s words to the Christians of Philippi, what touches your heart?

What phrase from this reading lingers in your memory?

What touched you most when you heard the proclamation of the Lord’s Passion from the Gospel of Luke (22:14-23:56) at Sunday Mass?

For Children: Share how you sometimes make sacrifices for the good of others?

A Question for all: HOW WILL YOU KEEP THE THREE DAYS OF EASTER?
